Dr. Nadeem Ahmad, the organizing chairperson of CARCON '17, briefed the audience about the two-day conference and said that during the conference eminent speakers, research scholars and students would participate and speak on the topic. The two-day conference consisted of plenary sessions, oral presentation and poster presentation.

The inaugural ceremony of the conference started with a welcome address by Dr. M.Z. Idris, Dean, IIMS&R. Prof. (Dr.) V. N. Tripathi was all praise for the relevance of the theme of the conference and said how Indian Academy of Paediatrics has included vaccination of rabies in its national immunization schedule. He said, "we have achieved many milestones in medical science like Infant Mortality Rate which was 150 out of 1000 in the year 1947 but is now 0.2%." He further said that small pox has been almost eradicated and in January 2014 WHO declared South-East Asia Region as Polio-Free. Death due to AIDS almost went down to 1/10. He said that it is no magic at all, it happened because of the hard work of all the dedicated doctors and paramedics working in the field.

While addressing the students, he said that it was the right time for them to collect as much information as they could on the topic covered by renowned scientists and experts of medical science. HRDC, Integral University Organized a Special Lecture on GST

Human Resource Development Center (HRDC), Integral University, conducted a special lecture on “Implementation of GST— What it brings with it for India” on 21st August 2017. The lecture was delivered by Prof. S. C. Sharma, Director, International Business School (IBS) Gurgaon. The expert opined that the GST would minimize the complex and multiple taxation system in the country and the economy would be more stable. He further stated, Taxation has been an integral part in the history of human civilization across the ages. The new GST will help build a transparent and corruption free tax administration. It would also reduce the number of indirect taxes. He further added that it will not be a cost incurred by registered retailers. Therefore, there would be no hidden taxes. As a result, the cost of doing business will be lower and prices will come down. The unregistered sectors will also be registered. Nevertheless, the changes will not come immediately but in the years to come, therefore, GST cannot be seen in isolation. The country's economy will reach the zenith and will match with the advanced economies of the world.

The new GST will be levied only at the final stage of consumption and will be based on VAT principle. He also predicted some side effects as said by some economists. They are of the opinion that GST in India would impact negatively on markets such as the real estate. The participants took a lot of interest in discussions after the lecture.

Rural Agricultural Work-Experience Programme (RAWE) held at Integral University on 09 October 2017

Installation of 1 MW Grids Interactive Solar Power Plant at Integral University

In compliance of 'Paris Climate Accord', as also to deal with the mitigation of greenhouse gas emission, the Government of India has taken a big initiative for expanding the use of clean energy in all sectors in the country. The electricity generated from SPV Systems is fed to the distribution or transmission grid after conditioning it to suit grid integration. Rooftop Solar PV Systems are easy to install and maintain, have a long life of approximately 25 years, and are modular in nature i.e. their capacity can be enhanced to meet with future requirements. With this background in view, Integral University has taken the initiative for the installation of 1MW Rooftop Grid Interactive Solar Power Plant in the University as per Solar Corporation of India bid. Apart from 35% to 40% revenue saving to the University, the plant will abate around 700 tons of carbon dioxide annually and reduce emissions from Grid Power and backup diesel generators.

In pursuit of its agenda to 'transform, energise and clean India', Integral University is going Solar and reducing its dependence on conventional power. It is a major step towards achieving the Government's vision.

A Research Grant of Rs. 23.50 Lakhs Sanctioned to Integral University

The primary technological goal is to develop a new methodology for biodiversity assessment in the different cyanobacteria on the basis of UV-protecting compounds. The cyanobacterial strains which have high capacity of producing UV-B protectants are characterized and grown under UV-B stress. The efficiency of these techniques will be compared with the "classical" methods for producing of UV-protectants, thereby, monitoring the biodiversity. The synthesis of UV protecting pharmaceuticals will be enhanced in these strains through media optimization using statistical approach. The UV protecting compounds find huge applications in pharmaceutical and cosmetic industry. These cost effective pharmaceutical product/s are expected to find numerous applications in various reputed cosmetics and pharmaceutical industries as a major supplement, thereby, leading to the development of cheap products. This methodology may also generate employment opportunities which will aid in the growth and development of the nation. Simultaneously, Prof. (Dr.) Iffat Zareen Ahmad is also investigating another prestigious project, having a research grant of Rs. 69.93 lakhs under the EMR scheme from the Ministry of AYUSH, Government of India.

While there is an ample need for lower segment housing, more and more houses have been built in the higher category leading to large stock of unsold and unutilized housing units across the country.

Prof. D.C. Thapar talked about solving the core issues like shelter-less population, housing for all etc., which are a common feature across India. He assured the audience that if we plan our policies through architectural control mechanism; such basic problems will not arise at a later stage.

Ar. (Dr.) Arun K. Rana, with his experience in the public sector, discussed the various government policies which have been implemented successfully in the past. There was a panel discussion in which the major issues raised were; firstly, reducing the cost of houses and bringing it down to be afforded by the poorest of the poor. Another one was to consider the social and cultural aspects of the community which is to be fulfilled. Instead of imposing ideas as an architect by going in for high rise development, we should try to understand the true need of independent low rise units which give the feel of a home in our context.
